

The foreword and introduction attempt to narrate the steps and breaths of the builders of residencies, those (curators and artists) who set out to reach a small dream and enchant a place in order to host creative processes and safeguard authors' visions: explorers and wayfarers on their way back. The Italian way to residencies has been characterised by profound dialogue between the public and private sectors, and by listening to institutions (the Ministry, Regions, Provinces, Municipalities) that have supported the emergence and growth of residencies: from out-of-form prototypes, to the development of exemplary regional systems. At the same time, creating an effective national system that includes the value of differences and is prepared for connections between research, training and the production of new work.

Three contiguous working groups to challenge certain branches of residencies that are intertwined with political, cultural and social transformations taking place, and with the urgencies stemming from practices of performing and scenic arts, both inside and outside theatres. After the speeches and talks on the first day, the proximity looked for in the roundtables will allow for a greater and deeper circulation of everyone's knowledge, by listening to different national agreements at the service of a European artistic and the organisational panorama that is constantly changing.

### Accompanying artists towards production

To reflect and exchange on certain meanings of accompanying and caring for an art project towards scenic composition, production of the work and its presentation to the public, starting from the practices of residencies, or from the complexity of the current performative languages. From economic sustainability to critical observation, from hasty reasoning to the sharing of a dream, accompanying may mean, going together in order to understand the fragility and power of creative processes scattered across fields, where scarecrows play, in turn, with aesthetics and ethics.

To reflect and discuss specific meanings that run through the, Stronger peripheries European project: the role of peripheries and the dialogues between peripheries and the centre. Political, cultural and social questions that together (or separately) travel across the state of the art of our time bouncing in and out of communities, theatres and institutions. For several years, qualified experiences of reviews, festivals and residencies have been the expression of an exemplary new season for peripheries. An extraordinary vitality also marked by a progressive regeneration of places and landscapes, real estate and commons, including the aggregating values of limits and margins.



### Building bridges across European scenes

The roundtable discussion is organised with the contribution of the *University of Barcelona*, Spain

In order to reflect and discuss certain meanings of European scenes, acknowledging one another, blending and reforming along the roads that move away from the identities of both their geographical and cultural borders, in order to trace other artistic matrices and new understandings that favour the knowledge and passage of artists and works from one side to the other. Pathways, crossings and communication bridges aimed at provoking frictions between the different political and artistic experiences crossing Europe- including smoke signals and the lightness of footprints that tell of the levity of the wayfarers' journey.

Each participant will have the opportunity to attend the three working tables in turn, each lasting 45', with a break of 15' between each table. Participation in the working tables represents an opportunity for discussion and in-depth analysis of some specific residency themes connected with the national scenic and performing arts systems of our time.

After lunch, the witnesses will report back in the plenary session the considerations of the working groups, highlighting possible affinities and divergences between the European scenes.

A summary of the resulting conclusions from the working groups will also have the function of provoking a reflection on the physiognomies of the cultural and social landscapes combining the vocations of the individual and organisational artistic matrixes with the environments that welcome and convey the meanings of the communities. The overall outcome of the considerations emerging from the groups will be the willingness on the participants' part, to continue in the work of building residency projects questioning the value of creative processes in their respective contexts; ensembles of performing arts and perspectives of new possible worlds.

The process of establishing and defining differences has been at the heart of the European project, since its origins. Do we believe that this idea of a 'good Europe' is the key to building the future of European peoples? We may need more roughness, dismantling a 'colonial' remnant in an overly pacified European vision. How are we to strengthen, through residencies, polycentric, non-aligned discourses able to preserve the tension generated in the encounter with the other? Which artistic discourses, thinking particularly of the Balkan area, are sending out harsh but necessary signals?

Along the pathways of communication and the mobility of artists, the culture of residencies could trace migration routes and a turnover of experiences, within the inside of national identities and the outside of European scenarios, outbound and inbound. The source of residencies contemplates the principle of the crossing of territories and the expansion of borders, sustained by an incessant search for passages and shifts of territories, new technologies and anthropological transformations.
